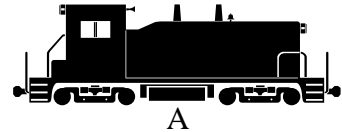
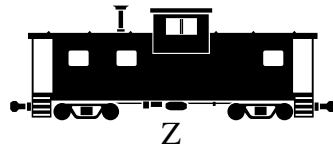
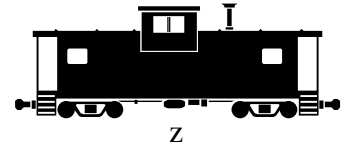
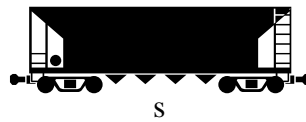
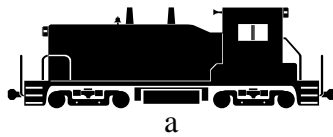


The accompanying font files contain a small sample of the silhouette fonts. Even if you are interested in the lettering fonts, please use these files to make sure you can install the fonts and get them to work before you purchase any fonts (this will save both of us a lot of headaches).

If you are reading this, then you have Adobe Acrobat up and working. However, this does not mean you have the fonts installed. So, follow the installation instructions below, restart all programs and then try to create and print a new document using your favorite word processor, the TrainDemo font and the following legend information:



-To add track, use "(" and ")" on the following line at the same point size or "9" & "0" at 1/4 the point size.

INSTALLING THE FONTS

The following explanation assumes you are installing Alphabet Train. Follow the same procedure for other fonts.

Mac:

On the Mac, the postscript version will require two files, one with the entire font name and the suffix, ".bmap" (the icon looks like a suitcase) and one with a truncated version of the font name (the icon looks like a laser printer). The True Type version requires just one file with the suffix, ".suit" (the icon looks like a suitcase). Consider the following example which assumes you are installing the "Railroad Roman" font:

Post Script:

Just drag the files: "RailroadRoman.bmap", and "RailrRom", onto your system folder and restart any applications that are currently running.

True Type:

Drag the SINGLE file: "RailroadRoman.suit", onto your system folder

WARNING!!!

DO NOT INSTALL THE TRUE TYPE AND POST SCRIPT VERSION OF THE SAME FONT AT THE SAME TIME.

Windows:

Windows 3.x:

Locate the FONT control panel and open it. Select the "Add Font" button. Locate the True Type version of Alphabet Train on your disk drives (it has the .TTF suffix)

If a complex True Type font fails to print, you may be able to solve the problem by changing the OutlineThreshold setting in the [True Type] section of your Windows WIN.INI file. The default setting is 256 (pixels per em (if you don't know, don't worry)) and has a range of 0-300. If you change it to 70 (i.e., OutlineThreshold=70), the True Type font might print. The price of this improvement may be a slower print speed. As I understand it, by lowering the OutlineThreshold, you are decreasing the amount of memory needed to print the fonts.

Windows95,97,etc.:

Go to Start, then Help, then index, then "adding new fonts" and follow the directions.

Other IBM/PC operating systems or applications:

Follow the application specific instructions for installing a Post Script or True Type Font

LICENSE AGREEMENT

By using the software you are agreeing to be bound by the terms of this agreement. If you do not agree to the terms of this agreement, do not use the software and destroy all copies in your possession.

The artwork, fonts and software are owned by Benjamin Coifman and are protected by United States copyright laws and international treaty provisions. The fonts and artwork are provided "as is". Under no circumstances shall Benjamin Coifman or any of his business associates be liable for any incidental, special, or consequential damages that result from the use or inability to use the fonts, even if Benjamin Coifman has been advised of the possibility of such damages. In no event shall Benjamin Coifman and his associates' liability exceed the license fee paid.
